2. ABSENCE FROM TESTS

- 2.1 Valid reasons for absence from tests include medical certificates, school approved activities or other reasons acceptable by the school. A parent's letter will **not** be accepted as a valid reason.
- 2.1.1 Students with valid reason for absence from tests will be required to sit re-tests within a 5-day period, subject to test papers not being released to other students. After the 5-day period, students will sit the missed papers as practice papers and marks computation will then be based on remaining CA components.
- 2.2 Absence from any test without a valid reason will result in zero mark for the test.

3. PLAGIARISM AND CHEATING

- 3.1 Plagiarism and cheating will result in zero mark for the assigned work as well as other disciplinary actions.

4. PENALTY FOR LATE SUBMISSIONS

- 4.1 Students who are unable to submit the Performance Tasks and/or Alternative Assessments by/on the deadline will be given an additional 7-day grace period to complete the work. This is subjected to the approval by the HOD of the respective subjects.
- 4.2 If students submit the work within the given 7-day grace period, they will only be awarded 50% of the marks scored.
- 4.3 Students who do not complete the Performance Task and/or Alternative Assessments at the end of the 7-day grace period will be given a zero mark.
